Last week: 1st chapter: On our creation - let the fact that you exist, even with your frailties and past failures, be a source of awe that God wanted you to come into being and to be with Him for all eternity, sharing in his charity. May grace allow you to keep faith as your guide through the challenges of your pilgrimage.

This week: The foundational question is – Where is faith in our lives. We think of family, friends, work, rest, vacation, sleep, diet, exercise. Do we place faith as just one of the spokes on the wheel with these or as a center from which other spokes connect and find their place? God provides the criteria by which we order and balance all the details of our lives and find our meaning and purpose.

Patriotism: Dealing with the virtue "pietas," dutifulness, which is part of the virtue of Justice, St. Thomas Aquinas writes: "The principles (or origins) of our being and governing are our parents and our country, which have given us birth and nourishment. Consequently, man is debtor chiefly to his parents and his country, after God. Wherefore, just as it belongs to religion to give worship to God, so does it belong to "pietas," in the second place, to give reverence to one's parents and one's country. Thus, patriotism comes within the sphere of virtue, duty, and moral obligation.
